

Day 1: Los Angeles

Upon arrival at Los Angeles' international airport, meet greet and transfer to hotel

Day 2: Los Angeles - Santa Barbara - Paso Robles (220 miles/354 km)

Board the motor coach and depart for the California coast following the historic "El Camino Real". Explore Santa Barbara, often referred to as the pearl of the American Riviera and known for its Spanish Colonial Style architecture, lush vegetation and laid-back lifestyle, and briefly visit the Mission. Early afternoon arrival to Paso Robles, once California's wine lovers' best kept secret, now the new hotspot for oenophiles and star on the international wine stage.

Day 3: San Francisco

Morning sightseeing of one of the most beautiful cities in America including highlights such as Union Square, Chinatown, Golden Gate Park and Fisherman's Wharf with a view of infamous Alcatraz Island across the bay Afternoon at leisure.

Day 4: San Francisco - Wine Country - Sacramento (203 m/326 km)

Depart through picturesque Sonoma and Napa to California's Capital, Sacramento. Start this day, dedicated to the epicure and the curious equally, on the famous Sonoma Marin Cheese Trail. Taste some of the local artisan cheeses during a cheese sampling. In world-renowned Napa, you will enjoy a tour of a winery followed by wine tasting. Upon arrival to CA's capital Sacramento, an orientation tour will include both Old Town and the Capitol Building.

Day 5: Sacramento h Yosemite National Park h Fresno (265 m/426 km)

Early departure to Yosemite following Historic Highway 49, which winds and meanders through mining towns of days gone by, when James Marshall discovered Gold in California at Sutter's Mill in 1848 and set off the largest gold rush in history. A stop will be made in the charming town of Columbia, known as the "Gem of the Southern Mines". Continue to Yosemite National Park, the most popular natural tourist destination in California. Enjoy the beautiful scenery of Yosemite Valley with its majestic rock formations and breathtaking waterfalls. In late afternoon, travel through the fertile San Joaquin Valley, known as the fruit bowl of the nation, to Fresno, the final destination today.


Day 6: Fresno - Sequoia & Kings Canyon National Parks - Bakersfield (193 m/311 km)

Follow into the steps of explorer John Muir and visit Kings Canyon and Sequoia National Parks. These two parks lie side by side, united by the scenic Generals Highway, and encompass the most rugged portions of the Sierra Nevada. The landscape testifies to nature's size, beauty, and diversity - huge mountains, rugged foothills, deep canyons, vast caverns, and the world's largest trees, Sequoiadendron giganteum. In all the world, sequoias grow naturally only here, on the west slope of the spectacular Sierra Nevada, in some 75 groves that tower above the surrounding forests. In the early evening, arrive in the small town of Bakersfield, an "All-American town" in the Southern Joaquin Valley and home of the Bakersfield Sound.

Day 7: Bakersfield - Death Valley National Park - Las Vegas (378 m/608 km)

Today you will visit Death Valley, the largest national park in the continental U.S., with its most famous sights:

Zabriskie Point, Furnace Creek Visitor Center, the Borax Museum, and Badwater — the lowest point below sea level in the western hemisphere, an incredible scenery basking underneath the world 's hottest sun. Continue to the man-made paradise of Las Vegas and for one evening enjoy this boomtown resort, featuring non-stop casinos, fabulous entertainment, great restaurants and attractions.





Day 8: Las Vegas

Enjoy a day of leisure in Las Vegas. Visit some of the spectacular hotels, take one of the many optional excursions offered or simply relax by the pool. Las Vegas has something for everyone, so take the whole day to explore this world-famous city

Day 9: Las Vegas - Zion - Kanab (323 M/518 Km)

Today you will explore Zion, Utah's first national park and old home of the Paiute tribe. Board the convenient park shuttle and follow the Virgin River through the narrow canyon it sliced, all the way to the Temple of Sinawava, admiring the buttes and mesas it left standing as lone islands rising up from the valley floor. In the afternoon, continue to Kanab, Utah 's Little Hollywood.

Day 10: Kingston-Toronto (263 Km)

Depart early from Kanab and do not forget your camera. Start the day with a short half-mile walk to Horseshoe Bend Overlook. The slow-flowing green waters of the Colorado River contrast with the Navajo sandstone as they are turning 270 degrees to offer one of the most spectacular and oft-photographed images of the American Southwest. Continue with a tour of the Upper Antelope Canyon and chase photographic opportunities created by the beams of sunlight hitting the tall walls of one of the most spectacular slot canyons in the world. In the afternoon, discover Grand Canyon National Park, one of the seven natural wonders of the world. A powerful and inspiring landscape, the Grand Canyon overwhelms the senses through its immense size: 277 river miles (446 km) long, up to 18 miles (29 km) wide and a mile (1.6 km) deep. Overnight in Flagstaff, iconic town on Route 66.

Day 11: Flagstaff H Palm Springs (402 M/646 Km)

Departure to Palm Springs via Historic Route 66 and Lake Havasu City, which was created with the construction of Parker Dam. Today 's destination is the glamorous desert resort city of Palm Springs, which enjoys a stunning setting in the Coachella Valley.

Day 12: Palm Springs h Los Angeles (110 m/177 km)

Leave the desert landscape behind by heading west to Los Angeles to enjoy a tour of this iconic and fascinating city. See all the sights of the "City of Angels" including Los Angeles Downtown and Olvera Street, famous Hollywood Boulevard, Mann's Chinese Theater, the Walk of Fame, Sunset Strip, Rodeo Drive and exclusive Beverly Hills.

Day 13: Los Angeles

Transfer to the airport for your departure flight.
